

Malvern wins Queen's Award for second year running

UK-based materials characterisation company Malvern Instruments is celebrating winning the Queen's Award for Enterprise in two successive years. Details of the 2011 awards were announced on 21 April, with Malvern receiving the Queen's Award for Enterprise in the category of International Trade, the seventh time the company has been recognised in the Queen's Awards.

"I don't normally boast about our successes, but this really is an achievement that should make everyone working for, or associated with, Malvern Instruments proud," said managing director Paul Walker. The company, which employs around 200 people in the UK and 600



worldwide, designs and manufactures scientific instruments that are used to measure the physical and chemical properties of materials. More than 90% of its production is exported.
